Corona and digitization: Latvian MEP Ijabs discusses Europe's fate with youngsters

Ijabs: "We are seeing a deficit in Europe right now"

On first of July, 6:30 p.m., the digital German-Baltic Conference (DBKdigital) will take place for the second time. Now, Latvian MEP Ivars will take a seat on the online podium. He will discuss current political topics with more than 150 youngsters from the Baltic states and Germany: How did Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania cope with the crisis? How could the epidemic change our digital world? How do we save the European community from falling apart?

Ijabs keynote speech is titled: "Digitization, discourse and social cohesion". In the preliminary interview Ijabs described himself as a passionate European: " We are seeing a deficit in Europe right now, such as the many different nation-state health systems. Shining personalities must now push ahead with the European idea."

The German-Baltic Youth Office (DBJW) is committed to exchanges between young adults from Germany, the Baltic States and Russia . The DBKdigital is intended to make the voices of young people heard - even during the epidemic. The conversation takes place on the Zoom platform; the working language of the second meeting is German. Participation is free of charge.
